**Clean-Up Day**

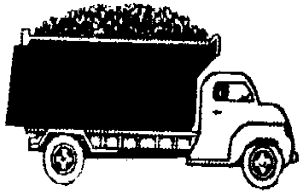
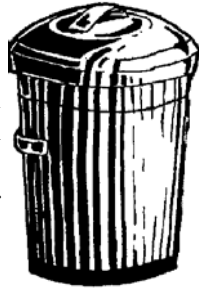

Town Council will be out as a group that morning to clean up along some of our streets. Town staff will begin their rounds at 4:00 p.m. to pick up the bags on the side of the roads. Individuals, civic organizations, church groups and other groups are encouraged to give a little of their time to clean up the Town.

## Trash

The Town of Glasgow contracts for weekly trash pick-up from the "curb-line" of the streets. The normal pick-up day is Tuesday and they begin their run here in Glasgow at around 7:00 a.m. The only time this changes is if a holiday falls on a Tuesday or the contractor has some sort of emergency which would delay pick-up. Containers with trash should be placed at the curb-line no more than 12 hours before pick-up and must be removed from the curb-line within 12 hours after pick-up.



To have appliances, furniture, brush (cut by the property owner), and other rubbish hauled to the landfill by the Town please place it in the alley where the workers can access it and call the Town Hall to let us know it

needs to be picked up.

Remember, as you cut tree limbs and brush to keep the length less than 8 feet and place the limbs in an orderly pile in a place where our workers can access them with

## How to read the statement

Included with this newsletter is a statement of your water account. You will continue to receive this statement from us every three months. The statement is designed to be easy to read and understand. Only the last three months activity will be reflected on the statements you receive. So, the statement this month shows activity on your account beginning January 1, 2003 and ending on the date of the statement, March 14, 2002. When you see a negative number (-25.00) this indicates a payment you made and if it is in the "amount due" block, it represents a credit balance on your account. If you have any questions about your statement or need assistance in understanding what it tells you, please call us and we will take whatever time you need to be sure we are communicating effectively with you.

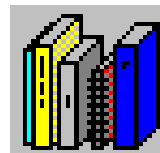
## Reminder About Water Bills

Remember, water bills are due on the first of each month and are late after the 15th of the month. The late fee is now \$5.00. Water service is terminated for accounts that are unpaid after 45 days. There is a \$25.00 fee to reconnect service that has been discontinued for non-payment.
